An Introduction to the Region F Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee (RHSOC)

The Executive Order 06-09, signed by Governor Matt Blunt in February 2006, established Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committees (RHSOC) with the charge of “establishing strategies and priorities for the Missouri Homeland Security Grant Funding programs and other Homeland Security initiatives”. In order to more effectively plan, manage, and administer the Homeland Security planning requirements and funding, the State proposed to organize into regions, based upon the existing nine (9) State Highway Patrol troop regions. Each region initially formed a Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee (RHSOC) comprised of one representative of 13 core disciplines - Director of Emergency Management, Chief of Police, County Sheriff, Fire Chief, County Health, Homeland Security Response Team (HSRT), City or County Public Works, Mayor or City Administrator, County Commissioner, Private Industry/Public Utility, Emergency Medical Service, 911, and the Volunteer sector. The disciplines of Agriculture and Education have since been added to the representation of the committee, making a total of fifteen core disciplines.

The primary purpose of the RHSOC is to administer plans, projects, and grant programs at the regional level. The Mid-Missouri Regional Planning Commission serves as the primary administrative agent for the Region F committee and fiscal agent for the administration of grant programs. The regional planning commission assists in organizational coordination and funding administration duties. **Region F** includes Audrain, Boone, Callaway, Camden, Cole, Cooper, Gasconade, Howard, Miller, Moniteau, Montgomery, Morgan, and Osage counties.

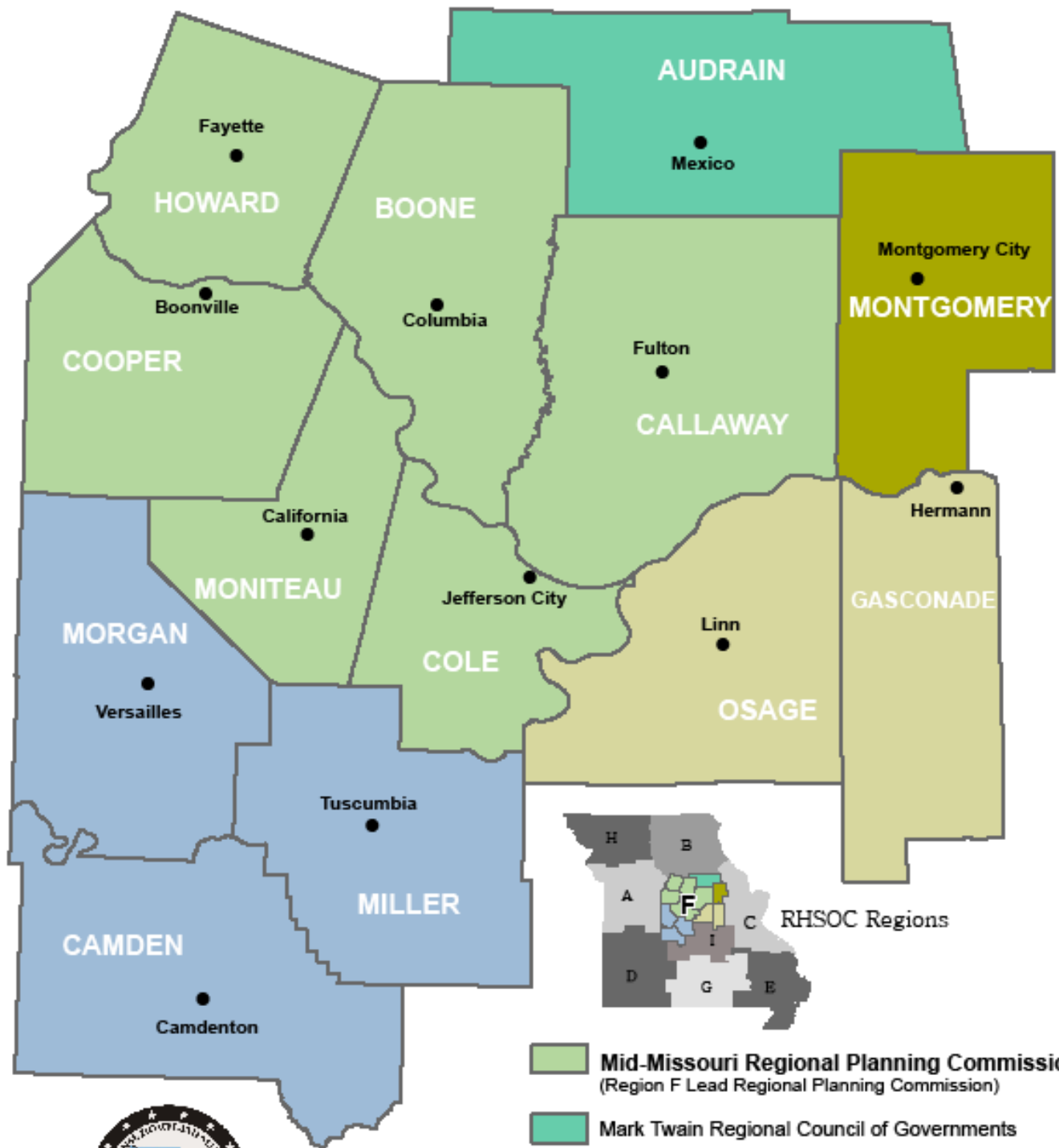

FY06 Region F RHSOC Grant Activities

FY06 Region-Wide Radio Cache

The Area F Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee established a radio cache with the FY06 Grant cycle funds in the amount of \$183,318. The purpose of the radio cache is for emergency communication in the event of a terrorist threat, natural disaster or scheduled events. A total of 126 hand held radios and accessories were purchased through this grant which allowed the establishment of three radio caches locations that are located in Boone, Camden and Cole counties.

The RHSOC also reallocated FY06 funds in the amount of \$50,000 for the enhancement of these radio caches. An additional 60 radios were added to the Area F cache. This addition will allow radio cache extensions in Area F allowing the 10 remaining counties to receive six radios. These counties are: Audrain, Callaway, Cooper, Gasconade, Howard, Miller, Moniteau, Montgomery, Morgan and Osage.



FY06 Region-Wide Communication Study

The region wide communication study was developed for each of the Region F counties. This study was completed to better understand the communication needs of each county, which also provided insight to the barriers of the terrain.



FY06 Satellite Communication Equipment

Both mobile and fixed satellite communication equipment was purchased for each of the thirteen Region F counties. The fixed equipment was installed in each PSAP. The mobile units were either installed in the county EMD vehicle or carried in a hard shell case.

The Region F RHSOC completed a mass care training exercise in the thirteen county region as part of the FY06 grant cycle. This training event was held on June 26, 2008, with the overall objective to determine the number and appropriate locations of shelters, bulk distribution centers, feeding stations, and number of volunteers needed during a mass care event. The exercise scenario was a severe thunderstorm / power outage in the central Missouri region occurring days after an earthquake event in southeast Missouri, with utility crews already dispatched.

All 13 counties in Region F participated in the event, with a total of 365 participants. During the exercise, emergency management directors and event controllers and evaluators noted strengths and improvements in the disaster response by the various entities. The After Action Report (AAR) and Improvement Plan (IP) is available for review as of August 11, 2008.

FY06 Business Emergency Planning Coordinator

Region F RHSOC contracted with Michael Pickerel to serve one-year as Donations and Resource Coordinator for Region F Homeland Security Oversight Committee (RHSOC), as approved in the July 2007 meeting. Pickerel coordinated with businesses in each county to secure donations and resource contracts to be utilized in disaster response and provided training in establishing/updating their emergency plans and preparedness.

FY06 Health Department Trailer and Supplies

The thirteen Health Departments within Region F received funding from the FY06 grant from the Department of Homeland Security in the amount of \$40,000. This funding was for the purchase of an emergency response trailer and supplies. This Public Health Response Trailer is an asset to the region and the purpose of the trailer is to support disaster events and the leading response agency in the event of an emergency. The trailer was received in Audrain County on December 3, 2008, and has since moved to Miller County on a 13 county rotation and is ready for deployment in the event of an emergency.



FY06 Columbia-Jefferson City Incident Support Team Equipment

The Columbia-Boone County and the Jefferson City-Cole County Incident Support Teams (IST) were awarded \$143,417 in grant money by the Region F Regional Homeland Security Oversight Commission to acquire equipment to allow for the teams to be self sufficient upon arrival to an emergency event.

The ISTs are a trained, multi-discipline, all hazards response resource for an affected jurisdiction to draw on to assist their staff with Command and General Staff incident management functions. During any type of natural or man-made disaster/emergency within the region, many jurisdictions will become overwhelmed in very short order. Many jurisdictions within the state have small populations and their first response agencies are composed of mainly volunteers, or individuals that serve in more than one position (i.e. Fire Chief and Emergency Management Director). Building a system that will provide consistent support during emergency situations is a priority. The ability of the ISTs to come as a complete package, able to meet all of their personal and work needs for the initial deployment period, is critical.



FY06 Mass Care Supplies

As a part of this project, each of the thirteen counties in Area F RHSOC received shelter supplies that can be mobilized to any shelter location and includes: 230 standard cots, 20 oversized cots, 75 special needs cots, 460 inflatable pillows 460 blankets and 1 enclosed trailer for transporting these shelter items

Live Deployment

On February 2, 2009 President Barack Obama approved Governor Jay Nixon’s request for an emergency declaration for the January 26-29, 2009 winter storm that left 117,050 homes and business in southeast and southern Missouri without power. The emergency declaration allows federal assets and resources to assist the State of Missouri’s emergency response. In addition to this federal and state response, the Region F Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee (RHSOC) assets have also been deployed to the southeast storm damaged areas. Seven Region F RHSOC counties sent trailers with supplies purchased through Homeland Security FY06 Grant funds. This assistance in disaster response included hundreds of cots, special needs cots, oversized cots, blankets,

pillows, and trailers to assist in sheltering residents in winter storm damaged areas in Southeast Missouri. At the peak of the disaster response, 55 shelters were opened, sheltering 10,772 people in Southeast Missouri. The Counties involved in this mass response were: Osage County sent to New Madrid Counties; Cole County sent to Ripley and Butler Counties; Camden, Cooper and Morgan Counties sent to Stoddard County; Audrain and Callaway Counties sent to Scott County. The sheltering supplies received in the city of Baxter, Stoddard County also afforded storm victims a hot meal. This disaster relief effort assisted many of the residents with much need food items in a time of emergency.

FY06, FY07, and FY08 Volunteer Management and Training

The Region F RHSOC, through Mass Care Coordinator, Lisa Binkley, has provided Mass Care and Shelter Operations training to over 200 local volunteers. Region F test-piloted a large-scale Mass Care training via an Internet feed to eighteen locations throughout Region F. Additional local trainings were also conducted.

Volunteers learned about disaster relief operations and the role they provide. They learned specific responsibilities for setting up a shelter, the intake of clients into a shelter, managing a shelter, and feeding clients in a shelter. Volunteers also learned about offering valuable services to clients affected by a disaster, such as health and mental health services, information about the progress of the disaster, and other community services that can affect their recovery. Volunteers learned specific skills in communications, assisting people with disabilities, working with the media, and donations.

More training sessions and volunteer projects will be conducted to continue building response capacity and maintain volunteer involvement. Volunteer trainings opportunities included: Mass Care and Shelter Operations, Pet Sheltering, and Volunteer Reception Center training.



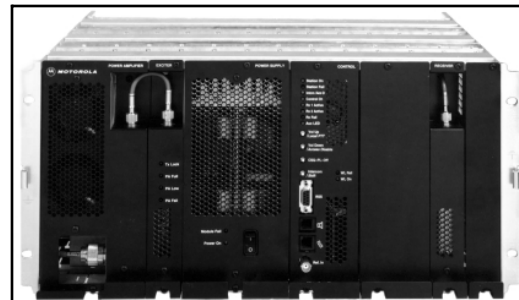
FY07 Region F RHSOC Grant Activities

FY07 PSAP Base Stations, Receivers, and Repeaters

The Region F RHSOC recently ordered P-25 upgradable Base Stations, Receivers and Repeaters for the Region's Public Safety Answering Points, (PSAPs), generally known as 911 call centers. The Region F RHSOC was granted funds from Missouri's Office of Homeland Security (OHS) to help meet regional needs. One of the needs identified by the 911 discipline group in 2008 was the ability to meet the Federal Communication Commission's narrowband requirements by January 1, 2013. The following county PSAPs in Region F will receive P-25 upgradable narrowband VHF equipment: Boone, Callaway, Camden, Cole, Cooper, Gasconade, Howard, Miller, Moniteau, Montgomery and Osage.

FY07 Mass Care Coordinator and Training

In FY07, the RHSOC committed to the continuation of the Mass Care Coordinator position from FY06 grant allocations, with specific focus on special needs and pet sheltering, including a training exercise for special needs.

FY07 Health Department Hand Held Radios

The 13 Health Departments in Region F were awarded FY07 grant funds for the amount of \$58,500. This grant was for the purchase of hand held radios. A total of 39 radios were purchased allowing each of the Region F Health Department three hand held radios and accessories. The thirteen Health Department are located in: Audrain, Boone, Callaway, Camden, Cole, Cooper, Gasconade, Howard, Miller, Moniteau, Montgomery, Morgan and Osage counties.

FY07 Large Animal Rescue Trailer

The Agriculture group received \$21,100. for the purchase of a Large Animal Rescue unit. This unit contains large animal equipment that is used for incidents and training programs. This unit will be housed in Boone County and will travel to incidents in need of large animal rescue and/or training such as live stock, horses and other large animals.

FY08 Region F RHSOC Grant Activities

FY08 Mass Care Coordinator Activities



One of the projects identified by the Area F Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee (RHSOC) in 2006 was selected to strengthen mass care capabilities. In an effort to locate and secure, provide manpower, and equip shelter locations within the Area F RHSOC, the committee saw the need for a mass care coordinator. The mass care coordinator (Lisa Binkley), along with American Red Cross and local Emergency Management offices have worked together to form more than 200 sheltering locations throughout the thirteen county region. New sheltering locations continue to develop with churches, schools, and civic organizations providing support with local facilities and volunteers. In the event of a disaster, these facilities will be used to supply basic needs such as food and shelter for those persons that have been displaced, or to distribute needed items and information in disastrous events.



The RHSOC continued the project funding into the FY07, FY08, and FY09 grant cycles. For these grant cycles, other focuses of the mass care coordinator will include adding pet sheltering and volunteer training. Pet sheltering has been a growing issue in devastating events. Within the FY08 grant cycle, Mrs. Binkley began addressing the pet sheltering issues. Through the volunteer training, trained individuals became part of the regional concept of this mass care coordination and will assist in events as needed.

FY08 Safe Sunday Disaster Training

More than 200 faith-based organizations in a 13-county, mid-Missouri region joined forces on Sunday, Sept. 12, 2010 to participate in the first-ever Safe Sunday Disaster Preparedness Day. The purpose of Safe Sunday was to provide individual and family preparedness education to 15,000-plus citizens and to encourage them to prepare their families for a personal or community-wide disaster.

Approximately 60 community volunteers contacted faith-based organizations in their communities to explain Safe Sunday and encourage participation in the project. Counties involved in the effort include: Audrain, Boone, Callaway, Camden, Cole, Cooper, Gasconade, Howard, Miller, Moniteau, Montgomery, Morgan and Osage. Local media efforts received positive response.

Safe Sunday was planned in conjunction with National Preparedness Month and was organized by Lisa Binkley, Mass Care Coordinator for Region F Homeland Security Oversight Committee (RHSOC). The project was coordinated in partnership with local emergency management and health departments, American Red Cross chapters, Community Emergency Response Teams, the faith community and other community groups. The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services provided and shipped its Ready in 3 disaster preparedness materials to the participating faith organizations at no charge. Most of the volunteers recruited to contact faith organizations have also been trained to work in disaster shelters, as part of a volunteer training project funded by Region F RHSOC.

Because people often turn to the faith community after a disaster, faith organizations were a perfect fit to help with distribution of this potentially life saving information to their members. Every citizen has a responsibility to prepare themselves and their families for a disaster. Safe Sunday provided an opportunity for well over 15,000 families to learn the steps they can make to prepare, making our Mid-Missouri communities more resilient to the effects of disasters.



FY08 Disaster Training and Education

In effort to strengthen Region F and better prepare for an incident, a Mass Care/Volunteer project was funded by the RHSOC. American Red Cross Shelter Operations training were offered throughout Mid-Missouri. Volunteers learned to work as a team to provide basic needs such as a safe shelter to sleep, food, emotional support, and information for recovery. The last 3 hours of the class was a tabletop exercise and provided participants an opportunity to practice their new skills. **Training was held on the following Saturdays from 9a.m. to 4 p.m.:**

April 10 in Fulton, Boonville, Mexico, and Eldon

April 17 in Jefferson City, Fayette, and Montgomery City

April 24 in Columbia, Versailles and Tipton

May 1 in Camdenton and Freeburg



FY08 Portable Explosive Detectors and Spectrometer

The Region F Homeland Security Response Teams (HSRT) received two XD-2i Portable Explosive Detectors that were purchased through the Department of Homeland Security FY08 grant with a combined cost of \$24,990. The new equipment will allow the HSRT to identify explosives quickly and accurately. This equipment is solution based and can detect more than 40 different types of explosives including: liquid explosives, black powder, nitrocellulose, smokeless gun powders, ANFO, nitrates, nitro-aromatics, plastic explosives, peroxides, chlorates, explosive taggants, as well as many other wet or dry threat explosives. The Ahura Spectrometer has Point-and-Shoot™ identification and operates directly through glass or translucent plastic containers, minimizing contamination and avoiding exposure to potentially harmful substances and limiting the hazard to responders.

FY08/09 Baldor TS80T Towable Generators



Just in time for the harsh winter months, nine mobile generators were delivered to the Boonville Emergency Management Agency for transfer to the following county Emergency Management Directors (EMDs): Audrain, Callaway, Cooper, Gasconade, Howard, Moniteau, Montgomery, Miller, and Osage. This activity was a part of the FY08 Grant from the Department of Homeland Security with a cost of \$225,934. The purchase of these generators

will strengthen the ability of the 911 call centers to continue operation during a power outage, supply power to a mass care shelter or serve other needs, as requested. Four more units will be purchased through the FY09 Grant for Boone, Camden, Cole and Morgan Counties.



FY08 Prime Mover for Public Health Trailer

The Region F Health Department's primary mover took residency in Miller County on April 1st. A cooperative agreement has been made between the 13 Health Departments allowing this equipment to be moved to an incident as needed. The Region F Health Department will annually rotate the primary mover and mobile health trailer as a single unit throughout the region. The primary mover's specific function is to tow the health trailer that was purchased with FY06 Homeland Security Grant funds to locations, as needed.



FY08 Training and Exercise for Region F Incident Support Teams (IST)

The Region F Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee allocated funding for an **All Hazards Incident Management Team (IMT) Training through the Missouri University Fire and Rescue Training Institute**. This institution is the recognized state National Fire Academy training authority in Missouri.

A total cost of \$47,000 provided training for up to forty four (44) Homeland Security Response Team (HSRT) members. Funds in the amount of \$45,000 were allocated through the FY08 grant activities from the RHSOC and the remaining \$2,000 was given by the Office of Homeland Security. This course provided the fundamental principles for developing, maintaining, and transitioning within a multi-agency network of emergency services and community stakeholders, in order to integrate these various groups into a fully functional Incident Management Team. This training focused on the importance of developing and operating as a functional Incident Management Team.

This class assisted individual responders to perform as viable team members by: emphasizing the nature and purpose of an IMT so that others in the community and emergency services can become more willing and able to assist within various components of their local IMT; providing a basic framework for building and maintaining critical interpersonal communications and for working together as a team member of an IMT; and offering practical experience of on-scene operations through extensive exercises and simulations, as well as through post-course refresher training which will provide students with the opportunity to perform as members of an IMT during a mock incident management situation.



FY08 iRobot Tactical Mobile Robot and Flash Resistant Uniform

The Jefferson City Task Force was granted a total of \$167,360 through the Region F RHSOC. \$150,663 of the funds went toward a tactical mobile robot and \$4,603 went toward flash resistance 5.11 tactical uniforms. This equipment was delivered in late December 2009. The robot has a key function of assisting officers in the surveillance of hostile and dangerous incidents. It has the ability to traverse hallways, stairways, open doors, deliver or retrieve items, function in extreme weather conditions and travel through hazardous areas. It can also be operated safely from an extended distance away from the target. The robot will be used for observation of an incident providing live feed back through an onboard camera system.

New flash resistance uniforms were delivered to the Jefferson City Police Department on August 25th. These uniforms were part of the requested gear that was granted to the Jefferson City task force to aid with bomb threats and hostage situations, as well as other events that can occur.

RHSOC Holds First Annual Meeting

On October 6th, 2009 the Region F RHSOC held its first annual meeting in Jefferson City. Since the 2006 inception the RHSOC has develop into a region wide collaboration of a public response groups with valuable insight for protecting the citizens of the Mid-Missouri region.

At this meeting, presentations were made regarding regionalism, H1N1 and equipment purchases made through grant monies provided by the Office of Homeland Security. Emphasis was placed on the importance of a regional collaboration of how to better protect the citizens of Mid-Missouri from natural or manmade disasters.

Dave Severson, Osage Beach Chief of Police and RHSOC FY08 Chair, passed the baton of leadership to Charles (*Chuck*) P. Witt Jr., Deputy Fire Chief with the City of Columbia. In addition, to Witt's leadership as the FY09 RHSOC Chair, Donald (*Doc*) Kritzer, Callaway County Commissioner, accepted the responsibilities as the Vice-Chair.

The new discipline primary and alternate members were elected for FY09. The new discipline primary representatives will assume discipline leadership responsibilities for their group and the primary representative is also responsible for attending the scheduled meetings throughout the year. Other duties include keeping the discipline group updated with the activities of the RHSOC as well as guiding the group, and voting on issues addressed in the RHSOC. In the afternoon regional assets were made available for public display.

The annual RHSOC meeting was significant because it provided one location for communication and collaboration between and within the fifteen RHSOC disciplines throughout the thirteen county region and it proved that the concept of regionalism is a key element in planning for emergency response and safety of Missouri citizens.
