**Missouri's 2007 DREAM Initiative -
Assistance with Downtown Revitalization
Applications Due July 6**

Gov. Matt Blunt has recently announced the opening of the Downtown Revitalization and Economic Assistance for Missouri (DREAM) initiative for 2007. The initiative was created last year to help small and mid-size Mo. communities the opportunity to revitalize their once prosperous and promising downtown areas. The program assists selected communities in understanding the various downtown revitalization, business development and residential resources available through state government programs. The Missouri Department of Economic Development (DED) is working with the Missouri Housing Development Commission and the Missouri Development Finance Board to provide assistance to the selected communities. The goal of the DREAM Initiative is to help the selected communities re-establish the properties in use in the downtown core, increase property tax values and sales tax opportunities, re-establish a sense of place and cultural heritage in the heart of the community, and attract private investment and new jobs.

Applications will be due by 5 PM on July 6, 2007 and may be obtained through the DREAM Internet site, www.dream.mo.gov/. Two applications are available, one for previous applicants who were not selected as part of the first ten and a second for first time applicants. Last year, communities selected included Cape Girardeau, Excelsior Springs, Hannibal, Hermann, Kennett, Neosho, Sedalia, St. Joseph, Washington and West Plains.

**MMRPC Transportation Committee to
Determine Transportation Priorities**

The Mid Missouri RPC Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) will evaluate transportation investment priorities for the Region at their July 25th meeting. This opportunity provides MoDOT and statewide planning agencies a list of potential investment priorities (projects or and/or general transportation initiatives) to pursue if the state's investment in transportation is increased. The priorities list includes the following categories-specific roadway projects, multimodal projects, and general transportation programs or initiatives.

Cities and counties should submit priorities by the end of June. This will allow time for MoDOT and MMRPC staff to compile cost estimates and supporting data prior to the TAC meeting on July 25.

June EDAC Meeting Change

The Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) meeting scheduled for **Tuesday, June 12, 2007 at 10:00 a.m.** has been changed to **Monday, June 11, 2007 at 10:00 a.m.** so that Mary Paulsell, Director of the University Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, can present current economic information and data regarding the Mid-Missouri region to the EDAC. The information provided by Ms. Paulsell will be incorporated into the current Mid-Missouri Regional Planning Commissions' (RPC) "Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy" (CEDS) document; this document is used by RPC staff and member counties and communities as an economic development planning tool.

The presentation will cover the state of the regional economy, trends, and resources for economic development in Mid-Missouri. The Mid-Missouri region has many unique advantages and opportunities for economic growth, including interstate and major highway access, and a concentration of higher education and health care facilities. In 2005, the per capita income in the Mid-Missouri region was \$29,888 (MERIC). The 2005 per capita income for the state of Missouri was \$31,231. All MMRPC counties except Howard have had a positive rate of economic momentum, as defined by the Missouri Department of Economic Development. Since 2000, there has been an overall 7 percent increase in housing units for the region, with growth in all counties.

Between 2002 and 2012, the MMRPC counties will see the largest declines in factory jobs, clerical positions, stock clerks, electronics assemblers, computer operators and tailors or dressmakers. The highest growth in the MMRPC counties will be in personal financial advisors, software and systems engineers, network systems analysts, vehicle mechanics, environmental engineers, fitness trainers, respiratory therapists and database administrators.

USDA Rural Development Offers Housing Grants

Pre-applications for USDA Rural Development housing grants are being accepted from government entities and nonprofit corporations until June 18. Housing Preservation grants are issued to eligible entities for repair or rehabilitation of individual homes, rental properties or co-ops and/or occupied by very-low and low-income rural residents. MODOT- Work Zone in Cooper County

Interstate 70 from Saline County line to Route M has been identified by MoDOT as a "top ten workzone". Lanes will be reduced eastbound for resurfacing work scheduled for completion in summer 2007. This area carries 28,000 vehicles a day. Expect lane closures during the day, and a reduced speed limit through the work zone.
