MoDOT- "A Conversation for Moving Forward"

The Missouri Department of Transportation has released an informational booklet- "A Conversation for Moving Forward" which highlights transportation challenges and issues in the State. This information was presented by MoDOT officials to the Legislature's Joint Committee on Transportation on June 11th, 2008. MoDOT cites the top five priorities as: taking care of our roads and bridges, doing a better job of providing other ways of getting around, rebuilding Interstates 70 and 44, addressing needed major projects, and meeting regional needs. According to this publication, Missouri has the seventh largest highway system in the U.S., with more than 32,800 miles of highways. That's more than Iowa, Nebraska, and Kansas combined. Area F Homeland Security Activities

Complete Mass Care Training Exercise

The Area F Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee, which includes all Mid-Mo RPC counties, (Boone, Callaway, Cole, Cooper, Howard, and Moniteau) recently completed a mass care training exercise in the thirteen county area. This training event was held on June 26, 2008, with

the overall objective to determine the number and appropriate locations of shelters, bulk distribution centers, feeding stations, and number of volunteers needed during a mass care event. The exercise scenario was a severe thunderstorm / power outage in the central Missouri region occurring days after an earthquake event in southeast Missouri, with utility crews already dispatched.

All 13 counties in the Area F region participated in the event, with a total of 365 participants. During the exercise, emergency management directors and event controllers and evaluators noted strengths and improvements in the disaster response by the various entities. The draft After Action Report (AAR) and Improvement Plan (IP) will be available August 11, 2008.

Mass Care Supplies Being Distributed

Over the past year, the Region F-Regional Homeland Security Oversight Community (RHSOC) has funded several projects to prepare for mass care, in the event of a disaster. This effort has included

identifying buildings in each county that can be used as shelters and feeding sites. During the past week, truckloads of cots, blankets and pillows have arrived. With the help of boy scouts and other volunteers, these shelter supplies will be loaded onto trailers (also funded by RHSOC) for each county in the

region. The supplies include much needed oversized cots and special needs cots. Counties will begin receiving their trailers and supplies on August 7.

New Economic Development Strategy for Mid-Missouri (August 12)

The Mid-Missouri Regional Planning Commission Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) is hosting a presentation by Mike Downing, Executive Director of the CORE "Connecting Our Regional Economy" Partnership. On August 12, 2008 at 9 a.m. at the Columbia Regional Airport, Mike Downing, the new executive director of the Missouri CORE Partnership, will be discussing the 12 county partnership created as a not-for-profit organization to pro-

mote regional economic development opportunities. The twelve counties include: Audrain, Boone, Callaway, Camden, Cole, Cooper, Howard, Miller, Morgan, and Moniteau, Osage and Randolph. The purpose of the CORE initiative is to promote and attract businesses and industry within the twelve counties.

The CORE Partnership is a private sector organization that formed in 2007, the major investors in the organization are Central Bank,

Premier Bank, Callaway Bank, Ameren UE, and the University of Missouri. Each investment entity has committed \$25,000.00 a year for the next five years. In addition to the major contributors funds are also being contributed by local businesses and each participating county based on sales tax receipts.
